Since 2017 Madres de Casino Rd nonprofit organization opened its doors with a mission of helping the diverse underserved families that reside in Snohomish County; especially, families who live in the Casino Rd neighborhood. Our mission thrives us to help vulnerable individuals with all the programs we provide to the community. These programs include our **Mental Health Education Series**, which provides access to mental health education. Paz Financiera workshop, where students learn how to manage their money through a fun and interactive set of classes; a **Training Seminar for Entrepreneurs**, which provides tools and information to assist Latino entrepreneurs with crucial business skills. We are also proud to offer various educational and skills training programs. Our Adult Education Programs are vital in supporting members of our

community who are illiterate or have not received a high school diploma. We also have Employable and Valuable Skills Classes in subject areas such as makeup, baking, and sewing. These classes provide knowledge and skills that are valuable not only to our participants' personal lives, but in their search for employment as well. Supporting families and youth is central to our organization. Since the COVID-19 pandemic, we have opened a Fresh Food Pantry to help supply families with food basics. The pantry has a cultural focus and includes fresh foods important to Hispanic culture. Our Youth Education and Empowerment Classes are helping youth to dream big and stay off the streets. These programs directly impact youth and families by fostering a community connection and giving people the skills and confidence they need to succeed.

There are thousands of low-income residents in our communities who are at the edge of losing hope due to unforeseen job loss, medical emergencies are among the troubles many families face. Madres de Casino Rd has made it our mission to offer resources that can bring hope for better tomorrow.

I can personally relate to the struggle many our families are living with, I too faced challenges when I moved with my family to this country. With limited resources and day to day hardships, it only encourages me to found Madres de Casino Rd to find and provide the resources to those in most need.

For the past five years Madres de Casino Rd has impacted the lives of many families by providing the resources that are needed to overcome life obstacles. It is important to mention that this work would have not been possible without our driven volunteers from students to parents, who donated their valuable hard work, dedication, and time. ## **MAKEUP CLASSES**

In this class, makeup artists practice beauty and corrective cosmetic applications for eyes, lips, cheeks and skin. They also learn about how to take care of the skin before applying any make up to the face. Makeup courses include learning the appropriate makeup looks for every day, and special occasions. Students enrolled in makeup courses use foundation, powder, blush, eyeshadow, mascara, eyeliner, lip pencil and lipstick. Classroom demonstration learning focuses on face shapes and skin tones, color theory, application styles and cosmetic trends.

## HAIRSTYLE CLASSES

After completing a basic beauty makeup course, students often enroll in a basic hairstyling class. This course covers a full complement of styling tools, like blow dryers, hot rollers and irons, and their uses for preparing period and contemporary hairstyles. Students practice general hairstyling methods and learn which styles best compliment the model or client according to face shape and occasion.

## **BAKERY LAB**

This course is a study of the fundamentals of baking including, dough, quick breads, pies, cakes, cookies, tarts and basic items made in a bakery. Topics include baking terminology, tool and equipment use, formula conversions, functions of ingredients, and the use of proper flours.

## **SEWING CLASSES**

## COSIENDO ENTRE AMIGAS

This class is for those students who wish to simply learn how to use their sewing machine. Students will make either pajama shorts or pants for their first project.

Then, they may select any project they choose. This class covers the fundamentals of beginning sewing for the new sewer, "haven't-sewn-for-years" sewer, and those who desire a refresher. Students choose their own project and work at their own speed. Includes measuring for pattern size, pattern selection and pattern envelope reading, fabric and notion selection, pattern layout, cutting, sewing machine use, and sewing to complete the garment.

# **CHRISTMAS WORKSHOP**

## PLAZA COMUNITARIA

Madres de Casino Rd is pleased to provide our community a Plaza Comunitaria in Snohomish County, Washington. The objective of La Plaza Comunitaria is to encourage, promote and operate educational services for Spanish speaking adults, who live, in our case in Snohomish County. This program educates people who are illiterate and people who only have a few years of school. By providing this program to our community, we are preparing people to start the GED program in any Community College.

In the past four years, we have been preparing people from our community to take the GED. We have provided tutoring to more than 40 students, which 35 out of them have obtained their diploma. With this program we have seen dramatic improvements with our students; they feel more confident and many of them have decided to continue their education in the local Community College; some have become nurse assistant, others hair dressers and more.

We have seen measurable success and now we are seeking to expand our education program by opening a Plaza Comunitaria. This work program in terms of adult education is presented between the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Mexico (Secretaría de Relaciones

Exteriores - SRE), the National Institute for Adult Education (Instituto Nacional para la Educación de los Adultos - INEA) and Madres de Casino Rd. The INEA only provides the program and Madres de Casino Rd must provide the classroom, computers, books, full furnished office, a full-time employee and of course the possibilities to the students to make photocopies. As you can tell, this is a wonderful program (project) but, it requires us to have funding to sustain it.

At the beginning, our Plaza Comunitaria will be offered 2 days per week during diverse hours, so people can find the best time slot for their convenience. Our goal is to open 5 days per week, but that will depend on the demand.

Besides the place where people can go study, a computer for testing, books, and photocopies, we are offering tutors so people can come and ask whatever question they might have. We will have a math and a Spanish tutor; each will work 10 hrs. per week.


