Like a proud mother hen watches over her chicks, I stood in awe as our students brought light and hope to women who needed it most, using their newfound skills as professional makeup artists. It was

more than just makeup; it was about making someone feel seen, loved, and valued. Despite facing obstacles themselves that day, our girls showed up with grace, strength, and a spirit that refused to be shaken. They put on their professional armor, stood tall, and showed the world what it means to be part of Madres.

The year closed on a truly high note, with a moment we will never forget—our first **Plaza Comunitaria**Graduation. Nine extraordinary women, who once doubted their own abilities, walked across that stage and received their elementary and middle school certificates. There were tears of joy, laughter, and a feeling of pride that cannot be put into words. For those nine women and for all of us, it was a dream come true—a powerful reminder of what is possible when we believe in one another.

Of course, none of this would have been possible without the love, dedication, and selflessness of our volunteers—parents, students, and community members—who donate more than 1,500 hours each year. 




